

Trailblazer Talks

Food - Friday 14h00 - 15h30 → Opening & Inspiring Stories on Food 🍑

The **Food Talks** at the Living Earth Expo will showcase inspiring stories of how food can be grown by anyone, regardless of resources, using minimal water and space—whether on a small backyard plot or at a larger commercial scale.

These sessions will explore **food security, small high-intensity farms, and local organic production**, setting the tone for sustainability-focused, solutions-driven discussions. Speakers will include **entrepreneurs** who have successfully built **sustainable and profitable** food ventures, demonstrating both small-scale success, and a commercial producer illustrating the potential of larger, investment-backed models.

The sessions will also highlight **innovative methods like food forests**, showing how diverse, regenerative systems can thrive in even the smallest spaces and adverse situations.

Water - Friday 16h00 - 17h30 → Inspiring stories on Water ◆



The Water Talks at the Living Earth Expo will dive into practical, real-world solutions for water scarcity, greywater food circles, and integrated water management, following naturally from the discussions on food. These sessions will focus on how individuals, communities, and businesses can harvest, manage, and reuse water effectively, making every drop count in Namibia's arid climate. Speakers will explore water harvesting techniques—from simple, affordable methods for private households to larger-scale public solutions that can transform landscapes. Attendees will learn how greywater can be repurposed for food production, how integrated systems can improve resilience, and what everyday people can do to secure their own water future. By sharing innovative, accessible, and proven strategies, these talks will empower individuals to take action, ensuring that water is not just conserved but actively harnessed as a driver of sustainability and regeneration.

Moderator: Temapo Negongo Lineup: ☐ Brenda Knoesen: How Biochar can be used to increase water storage in poor soils (such as those of the North where swales and half circles don't work - much like our Namibian version of Terra Preta). ☐ **Dr Roy Miller - SAUMA:** SAUMA fights to keep groundwater clean in most of Southern Namibia. Mining Pollution is the biggest threat to our most important aquifer and thus to farming. ☐ Ina Wilkie - Kambashu Institute: Showcasing success stories from informal settlements use of greywater food circles, greywater tower and dry toilets. ☐ Danou van Rensburg - Permaculture Otjiwarongo "Food Forest Namibia Youtube Channel": How to capture rainwater on a landscape scale with swales and "African Smiles" - showing result; rainwater harvesting and greywater systems in a township.

Energy - Saturday 09h30 - 11h00 → Energy Talk 🗲 🐺

The **Energy Talks** at the Living Earth Expo will provide a clear and actionable roadmap to **affordable**, **off-grid power solutions**, focusing on **solar home systems and sustainable energy options**.

As an early session, it will take advantage of fresh minds to demystify solar energy and prove that the solutions are already available and within reach for everyone—whether through buying a solar system for a home or leasing a smaller setup for basic needs. The discussion will highlight how solar is not only more cost-effective over time but also more reliable, reducing vulnerability to power outages.

Importantly, the session will emphasize how the transition to **renewable energy creates jobs**, supporting local economies and energy independence. The format will be **practical and solution-driven**, potentially serving as a **step-by-step guide** to going solar, empowering attendees to take real action.

To encourage immediate engagement, the session can also direct visitors to **stalls at the Expo** where they can explore solar products and financing options—making sustainable energy a real, tangible choice, not just an idea.

Shelter - Saturday 11h00 - 12h30 → Shelter Talk 🏝 🐬

The **Shelter Talks** at the Living Earth Expo will introduce attendees to **practical**, **affordable**, **and sustainable housing solutions**, focusing on **natural building**, **urban planning**, **and intentional communities**.

These discussions will highlight how local materials, smart design, and regenerative building methods can create homes that are affordable, climate-resilient, and comfortable. Whether for rural homesteads or urban housing, the session will showcase techniques such as sandbag, strawbale, and compressed earth block construction, alongside passive cooling, tree windbreaks, and energy-efficient design.

Beyond individual homes, the talks will explore better urban planning and intentional community models that foster stronger local economies, reduced crime, and more sustainable living environments, while being a vehicle to afford land ownership to the landless, especially in cities.

Attendees will leave with a clear understanding of their options, whether they are looking to build a home, improve an existing one, or rethink how communities can be designed for resilience and well-being.

The session will highlight **real-world examples of regenerative communities**, showcasing how shared infrastructure, participatory leadership, and circular economies can **transform regions from fragile to flourishing**.

By the end, the audience will be inspired to collaborate, connect, and take concrete steps toward building a Living Earth—where sustainability isn't just an idea, but a lived reality.
